WHAT'S HAPPENING THIS TERM:

Learning Assets

In order to be prepared for lifelong learning and to conduct purposeful inquiry, students need to master a whole range of skills which are relevant to all subject areas as well as life outside school. Students need time to develop the following skills for learning;

- Thinking Skills
- Collaborative Skills (Social Skills)
- Communication Skills
- Self-Management Skills
- Research Skills.

These Learning Assets will be explicitly taught so students can talk not just about 'what we learn' but also 'how we learn'.

Religion: Students will be learning about the different ways God and Jesus have been revealed throughout time to their believers. Students will examine religious artworks which portray different images and perspectives. We will be exploring closely; God the creator, the Trinity and the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Inquiry Unit

Health: This term, students will be focussing on how their choices can impact their bodies. They will look at the social, emotional and physical changes that occur from birth to adulthood and the factors that may influence emotions and behaviours.

Inquiry Unit

Science: Students will be learning about environmental issues such as geological and weather events and how they impact our world. They will look at the continents and investigate why certain environmental events occur in that region.

Physical Education and Personal Development: This term we will be practising a range of athletics skills in preparation for the carnival. Students are expected to attend and compete carnivals. Stage 3 will participate in gymnastics sessions from weeks 1-5 run by Southern Cross Gymnastics Club. Students will also have 3 week of Oz Tag clinics run by ACT Oz Tag.

English: This term we will be examining narrative, persuasive and news information report texts. We will look at the different structures that make each type of writing unique. We will also discuss modality words, conjunctions and connectives that will help our persuasive writing. Students will examine the writing process from draft writing through to publishing, where students are taught the skills to: make considered choices to expand vocabulary, use accurate spelling and punctuation and make and explain editorial choices.

- **Reading** Students will focus on gaining literal and inferred meaning of texts. Inferencing is when the students will unravel the implied meaning of words. Students will also be developing their research skills through reading information texts and will learn how to locate important information when researching a topic.
- Each child will need a paper novel of their choice to keep in their desk for the term. We will be encouraging each child to develop a love for reading. Being a good reader helps children to become good writers and communicators. Reading for 20 minutes daily will be non-negotiable and will be done without any interruptions. Please assist your child in finding an appropriate novel from your own home library, the school library or local public library.
- Literacy Groups Students will engage in Literacy Rotations that build reading, writing, grammar and punctuation skills which cater for individual needs.
- Handwriting Students are expected to develop fluent cursive handwriting in blue pen.
- **Spelling** Students will strengthen their sound and word knowledge through the continued use of the Sounds Write Program.

Arts: Visual – Students will explore the technique of collage using a variety of materials and processes. Students will be exposed to different artist and artworks.

Maths: Students will participate in mathematical investigations which will help promote discussion about concepts. These lessons will enhance their ability to apply their learning to a range of mathematical situations.

The concepts being covered include Number (place value with whole number, decimals, fractions and multiplication and division), Measurement (collecting data and posing questions and exploring different units of measurement), Geometry (nets of 3D objects), Algebra, Statistics and Probability (mean, median and range). We will challenge students to explain and communicate their logic and reasoning when solving problems.

HOME LEARNING

We believe that children can begin to develop a sense of responsibility for their own learning and time management skills through Home Learning. Home Learning can be a means for creating an important and appropriate link between home and school, directly involving parents in their child's education. Home Learning is an opportunity to develop existing skills through practice. We believe that Home Learning is also:

- A positive reinforcement of learning done at school.
- An opportunity for open-ended research for children who want to be extended.
- An opportunity for parent/child discussion about what the child is learning.
- A means of providing the teacher with feedback as to how concepts and skills have been grasped.

Home Learning requirements take into account the diversity of expectations placed upon children outside school hours by family and social commitments.

All children are expected to read for a minimum of 10 minutes each night

Mathletics

Mathletics is compulsory and students will be expected to complete tasks outlined in their home learning sheet. It is an excellent resource that is included in the school fees. Your child has access to this both at school and at home. The website is tailored to the student's development level and tasks are set by the teachers regularly in line with what they are teaching in class. Tasks are designed as practice and should be completed three times before moving onto the next. Each time completing a task the concepts stay the same but the questions will change to ensure the student masters the process required. Live Mathletics games are not part of compulsory Home Learning. Teachers will monitor participation and expect that this component is completed.

Home Learning Inquiry Tasks

Students will also be set fortnightly Inquiry tasks. Such tasks will be included on the Home Learning sheet. Bookwork Guidelines have been pasted at the front of all books. Please read this to familiarise yourself with the Sacred Heart bookwork expectations. We would also ask that you please sign your child's Home Learning book at the end of each fortnight to acknowledge the completion of their reading, Mathletics and Inquiry project. Home Learning will begin in Week 3. It will be set on Monday and be due on Wednesday of the following week. It may be submitted using Google Docs or as per classroom teacher instruction. If your child is unable to complete their Home Learning, please record a message in your child's book or send a note/email to their teacher.

STAGE 3- GENERAL INFORMATION

- We remind you that if your child needs to take medication of any type it should be sent to the front office, clearly labelled with their name, the time it should be administered and the correct dose. No medication should be kept in school bags or self-administered.
- Should you need to pick your child up during school hours could you please sign them out at the front office and then come to the classroom to collect them. Students should then be signed in upon their return.
- If your child is away for any reason, can you please ensure that you send in an **WRITTEN** explanatory note as soon as possible. You can do this 3 ways; email **DIRECTLY** to your child's teacher, through SZapp, or a written note.
- Here at Sacred Heart we are a 'Nut Aware' community. We would appreciate your co-operation in not including any nut products in your child's recess or lunch.
- If your child is unable to participate in fitness or sport, they must have a written note from home explaining why they are not participating.
- **Parent assistance** is always welcome in the Stage 3 classrooms. If you would like to assist in any way, please contact your child's class teacher. Each class is looking for a parent rep, if you would like to be the rep, please speak to the front office.
- Apps Please ensure you have downloaded all required apps for your child's iPad (if they are bringing a device from home). If there are any problems please speak with your classroom teacher.

UNIFORM

As a part of being responsible leaders of the school, students are expected to dress in the correct school uniform at all times. This includes wearing socks (which must cover the ankle), shoes (black school shoes and appropriate joggers), a hat, no nail polish and no jewellery. A note will be sent home if a child consistently wears the incorrect uniform.

CONFIRMATION

The students in Year Six will be invited to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation.
